Driving the Safety of Patients, Personnel, and People Policy

Thailand shares a unified commitment to advancing patient safety, in line with the resolutions of the 55th, 72nd, and 74th World Health Assembly, which call upon Member States to prioritize the quality of care, with a particular focus on patient safety. (Quality of Care: Patient Safety). The global action on patient safety and the Global Patient Safety Action Plan 2021–2030 reflect a strong commitment to developing healthcare systems that ensure quality and safety in patient care, protect healthcare providers, and expand the development of socially responsible healthcare systems. These efforts emphasize the safety of the public and communities, supporting the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to ensure healthcare systems are effective, efficient, resilient, and sustainable. Accordingly, Thailand hereby announces its **Policy for Driving Patient, Personnel, and People Safety (3P Safety)** to inform healthcare institutions, healthcare professionals, the general public, and service recipients of this policy and to express our collective commitment to its advancement as follows:

1. Establish national safety goals under the **National Patient, Personnel, and People Safety Goals**, and set strategic directions to drive forward the safety of patients, healthcare personnel, and the public. This will be achieved through collaboration and support from all relevant sectors, including diverse approaches, methods, and resources to ensure effective implementation.
2. Promote the utilization of data from the **National Incidents Reporting and Learning System** to foster learning and improve healthcare systems, ensuring quality and safety for patients, personnel, and people, at the institutional, regional, central, and national levels.
3. Promote the engagement of patients, personnel, and the people in the development of healthcare systems and other supporting systems to enhance safety, and quality of life for all.
